### Suspicious Activity

The Beaverton Police Department and Washington County Sheriff's Office are warning community members about two incidents of suspicious activity.

On the morning of September 5, 2018, Washington County Sheriff's office took a suspicious person report near SW Butner Rd/SW Spring Lane. A middle school student reported a male driving a white van pulled up next to her and asked if she needed a ride to school. The student reacted appropriately by telling the male "no" and continued to walk to school. The student reported seeing the vehicle several more times as she walked to school. The student later reported the incident to her parents who then called the Washington County Sheriff's office.

On September 14, 2018 Beaverton Police Department took a suspicious person report near Cedar Hills Blvd/SW Park Way. A middle school student reported a male, driving red Ford pickup, yelled at her in an attempt to have her get into his vehicle. The student reacted appropriately and found a trusted adult. The student reported the incident to her parents and school who then reported to the Beaverton Police Department. A search of the area by officers didn't locate the vehicle.

Beaverton Police Department and Washington County Sheriff's Office do not have any identified suspects at this time. Officers will conduct enhanced patrols in the area. Area residents are asked to report any suspicious vehicles to Washington County Dispatch at 503-629-0111.
