

Beaverton Police Department 2024 DUII Statistics

The Beaverton Police Department is committed to keeping our community safe, and addressing impaired driving continues to be one of our highest priorities. Throughout 2024*, our officers made 466 number of DUII arrests, helping to remove impaired drivers from our roads and save lives. Of those DUII arrests, 418 were for alcohol and 48 were cases where the officer suspected the driver was impaired by drugs.

While our patrol officers are always on the lookout for DUII drivers many of the DUII arrests made this year are done so through enhanced enforcement efforts funded by grants provided by the Oregon Department of Transportation and Oregon Impact. This grant funding allowed us to assign additional officers to overtime shifts specifically focused on DUI enforcement, ensuring our roads remain as safe as possible during peak times.

Driving under the influence is a serious crime that endangers everyone on the road. Nationally, impaired driving claims thousands of lives each year and leaves countless families devastated. Whether it's alcohol or drugs, driving under the influence is always dangerous and entirely preventable.

As we move into the new year, the Beaverton Police Department will continue its efforts to combat impaired driving through education, enforcement, and community engagement. Remember, it's never worth the risk—designate a sober driver, use public transportation, or call a rideshare service.

The Beaverton Police Department is asking for your help. "Let's work together to make our roads safer for everyone. If you see someone you suspect is driving under the influence, please call 911 and report it. Our officers will make your call a top priority" says Officer Matt Henderson.
