



Seeking Cell Phone Donations



The Beaverton Police Department has partnered with the 911 Cell Phone Bank and is now accepting donations of cell phones to benefit victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, human trafficking and other unsafe situations.

Cell phones—even without a service plan—may still be able to call 911 in the event of an emergency. These emergency 911 cell phones are an important part of overall safety plans for individuals who may need help and cannot get to any other phone. They provide a critical link between a person in an unsafe situation and law enforcement/emergency services.

Our building is open to the public 24 hours per day/7 days per week.

There is no need to include car chargers, accessories, or the operating manual. Phones will be cleared of all personal information. Cell phones that are not working or unable to dial 911 are recycled according to EPA standards.
